## DESCRIPTION

The inclusion of this indicator enables a focus on the interventions that are effective and evidence-based including a greater focus on prevention and treatment, which need to be considered alongside criminal justice measures for a balanced response to the issue. The NHS contribution to sexual assault services are a public health function. It is also the government's strategic ambition, as set out in *Call to end violence against women and girls 2010* and successive action plans to do what it can to contribute to a cohesive and comprehensive response.


Data for this indicator is based on police recorded crime data for the local areas irrespective of the home address of those involved in the offence.

# NE LINCOLNSHIRE JSNA INDICATOR SUMMARY

## NATIONAL, REGIONAL OR PEER GROUP

North East Lincolnshire forms part of the Humberside Police force area and is one of the four basic command units in the Humberside region. The overall trend in Humberside for crimes deemed 'violence against the person' has shown a steady decrease from 15.98 per 1,000 for the baseline year (2010/11) to 13.16 per 1,000 for the latest available data (2013/14). North East Lincolnshire has remained the second highest for crimes against the person in the Humberside region although the trend in North East Lincolnshire has reflected the regional decline in report crimes. The latest data for North East Lincolnshire, as shown in Figure 1, shows a rate per 1,000 population of 15.39 and this was statistically higher than Humberside rate.
