KEY POINTS

-ve	The percentage of individuals who were provided with a substance misuse triage assessment to determine dependence on drugs or alcohol, and were residents of North East Lincolnshire, and then required structured treatment having not already received it in the community (38%), was the fifth highest out of all the local authorities in the Yorkshire and the Humber.
+ve	The percentage of individuals who were provided with a substance misuse triage assessment to determine dependence on drugs or alcohol, and were residents of North East Lincolnshire, and then required structured treatment having not already received it in the community (38%), was significantly lower than the England average (47%).

DESCRIPTION

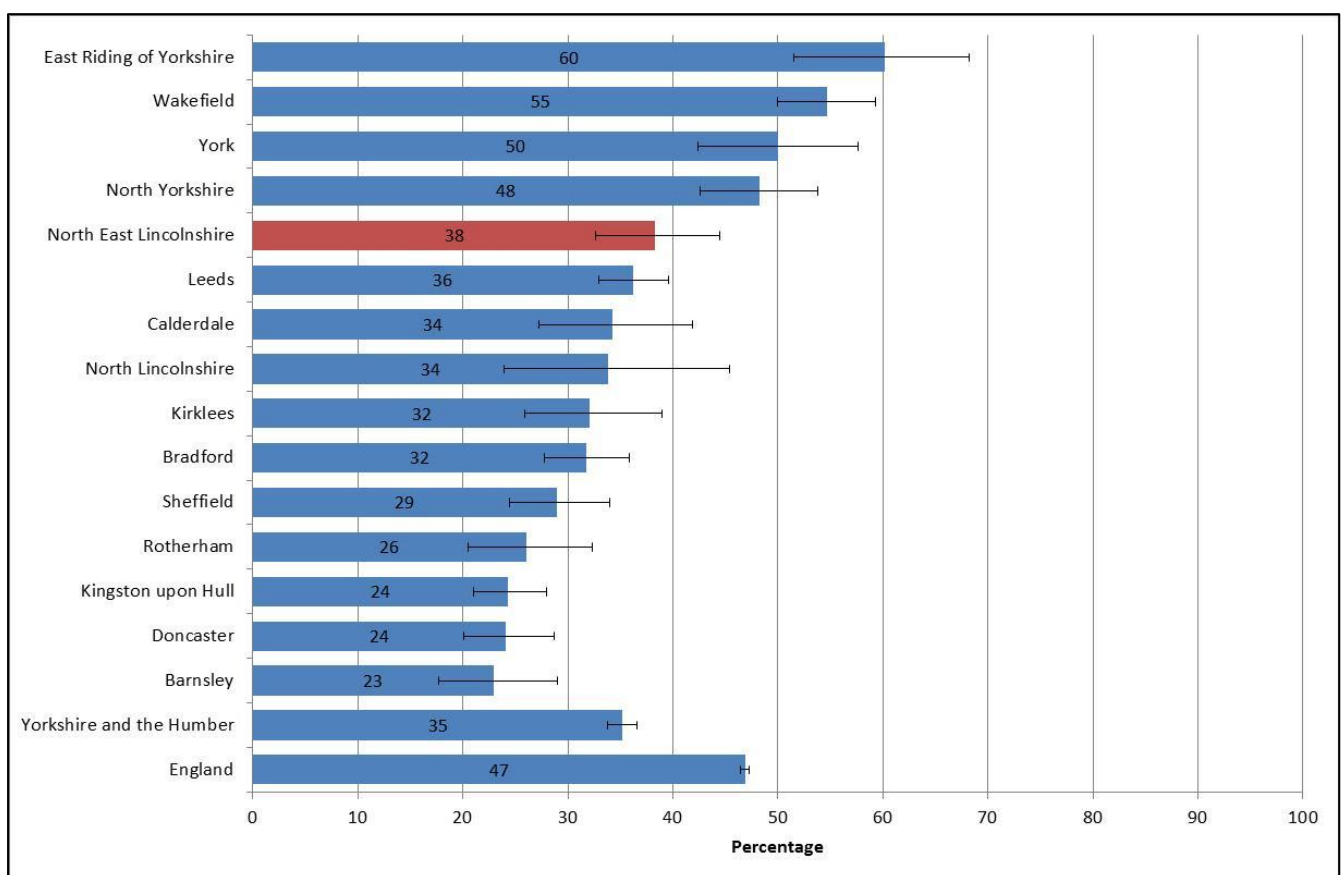
Ensuring that individuals with substance misuse problems receive appropriate and effective early interventions will reduce harms to health and improve well-being. Treatment interventions for the management of substance misuse can help to reduce re-offending. (Improving outcomes and supporting transparency - Part 2, Department of Health, 2012).

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NATIONAL, REGIONAL OR PEER GROUP

Figures presented in Figure 1 show that for 2012/13, 38% of individuals who were provided with a substance misuse triage assessment to determine dependence on drugs or alcohol, and were residents of North East Lincolnshire, and then required structured treatment having not already received it in the community. This North East Lincolnshire percentage requiring structured treatment was the fifth highest out of all the local the Yorkshire and the Humber, and was higher than the regional average (35%), however was significantly lower than the England average (47%).
